GENERAL DEPARTMENT RULES AND REGULATIONS:

1. This department has been set up for ALL youth, under the age of 19; excluding 4-H members who are currently enrolled in a project.

2. Only 1 entry per person, per class.

3. Only 1 premium paid to the exhibitor in each class.

4. ONLY CLASSES LISTED WILL BE ACCEPTED.

5. Entries that do not place may not be placed on display due to space limitations.

6. All entries must be made or grown by the youth exhibitor during the current year (August 3, 2025, through July 29, 2026)

7. No exhibit may be removed at any time before the close of the exhibition except by consent of management.

8. The judge may withhold awards where they feel the entry is not worthy. The judge's decision will be final.

1. No pigeon may compete in more than 1 class.

3. All entries must be of a recognized breed. No crossbred animals will be permitted to show.
4. All pigeons must bear a unique individual identification leg band but do not have to be identified with an official PDA leg band.
5. **Exhibitors will be paid only two (2) premiums per class.**

Each exhibitor must sign a statement as to the rabbit being free of known health disorders.

1. No rabbit may compete in more than 1 class.
2. Rules and regulations governing open classes will apply to this section. Make a note to refer to Department 9 for breed codes.
3. All rabbits are to be judged according to the latest standard of perfection to the American Rabbit Breeders Association with ARBA Show Rules to govern.
4. All entries must be of a recognized breed. No crossbred animals will be permitted to show.
5. All rabbits must have a permanent earmark and legible tattoo in the LEFT ear.
6. NO DOE AND LITTERS WILL BE ACCEPTED.
7. **Exhibitors are to provide their own containers for water and feed.**
8. Rabbits will be shown in 4 Class and 6 Class Divisions.
9. **Exhibitors will be paid only two (2) premiums per class.**
10. **Substitutions permitted in the same class only!**

3. The management will not undertake to return exhibits, nor be responsible for the return of exhibits. Baskets or containers must be supplied by exhibitors and will be given every possible care, but management assumes no responsibility for their safety.
4. Flowers or plants entered for competition must be more than ordinary standard and quality to be entitled to an award.
5. The management may, at any time, order the removal of any exhibit that is in bad condition. Any article manifestly unfit to show may be excluded.
6. Exhibitor, except in arrangement classes, must grow all entries.
7. No exhibit may be removed at any time before the close of the exhibition except by consent of management.
8. The judge may withhold awards where they feel the entry is not worthy. The judge's decision will be final.
9. Exhibits must conform to the number of blooms, spikes or stems specified in each class.
10. Flowers in each entry must be one color and variety unless otherwise stated.

3. Poster size must be either 14" x 22" or 14 ½" x 22". Other sizes will not be accepted for judging at the state level.
4. This year's theme is "Growing a Nation." Contestants will be asked to submit artwork that depicts the important role Pennsylvania agriculture played in providing innovative processes and solution that helped to grow our nation.
5. Exhibitors using other themes will be disqualified at the state level.
6. Exhibit **must** have wire and proper hooks for hanging. String, scotch or masking tape is **Not Acceptable**.
7. Posters will be evaluated on use of theme, visual appearance and creativity in relation to the exhibitor's age.
8. **Winning Exhibitors must bring their posters to Fair Office on the last day of the Fair, so posters may be submitted for State contest.**
9. Winning posters in each age category will be eligible to compete in a statewide competition held at the 2026 Pennsylvania State Farm Show. Prizes at the state level are 1st - \$100, 2nd - \$75 and 3rd - \$50.
