



## DEPARTMENT 11 YOUTH UNDER 19

### GENERAL DEPARTMENT RULES AND REGULATIONS:

1. This department has been set up for ALL youth, under the age of 19; excluding 4-H members who are currently enrolled in a project.

NOTE: 4-H members currently enrolled in a project can enter with a separate project.

2. Only 1 entry per person, per class.

3. Only 1 premium paid to the exhibitor in each class.

**4. ONLY CLASSES LISTED WILL BE ACCEPTED.**

5. Entries that do not place may not be placed on display due to space limitations.

6. All entries must be made or grown by the youth exhibitor during the current year (August 3, 2025, through July 29, 2026)

7. No exhibit may be removed at any time before the close of the exhibition except by consent of management.

8. The judge may withhold awards where they feel the entry is not worthy. The judge's decision will be final.

9. Sections listed below may have additional rules.

## **NON-POULTRY RULES AND REGULATIONS:**

1. Entries will be received until such time as cooping capacity is reached.
2. Refer to General Rules and Health Regulations for Livestock.
3. Exhibitors are responsible to feed, water, and care for birds.
4. Exhibitors will be paid only two (2) premiums per class.
5. Substitutions permitted in the same class only!
6. Only birds that meet the Pennsylvania Department of Agriculture's definition of non-poultry are permitted to be exhibited. Non-poultry are birds that are kept in a single household, the products of which are used within the same household exclusively, are not considered poultry, provided that they have no direct or indirect contact with poultry or poultry facilities. Birds that are kept in captivity for other reasons, including those that are kept for shows, racing, exhibitions, zoological collections, and competitions, and for breeding or selling for these purposes, as well as pet birds, are not considered poultry, provided that they have no direct or indirect contact with poultry or poultry facilities.
7. All non-poultry must be free of infectious and contagious diseases
8. An Owner Endorsed Avian Health Certificate and Biosecurity Statement and a Certification of Veterinary Inspection (CVI) valid within 30 days prior to the opening date of the exhibition shall accompany the poultry.
8. All non-poultry for exhibition shall meet the testing requirements set forth in section 7 of the PA Dept. of Agriculture 2026 Animal Health Regulations.

10. All non-poultry exhibitors must have a PA Dept. of Agriculture (PDA) Premise ID before their flocks can be tested for Avian Influenza and Pullorum. A Premise ID can be obtained for free via the PDA website.
11. Avian Influenza testing must be done 14 days prior to the date of entry on the fairgrounds. Test samples must be collected by a certified poultry technician or category II accredited veterinarian or a state or federal official and shall be tested at a National Animal Health Laboratory Network Lab.
12. All non-poultry must meet the health and testing requirements of the PA Dept. of Agriculture, Bureau of Animal Health and Diagnostic Services.
13. All entries must bear an official PDA-issued leg band.
14. Exhibitors must provide copies of all blood work papers to either the superintendent or the appointed inspector, along with a copy of the Owner Endorsed Avian Health Certificate and Biosecurity Statement and a Certification of Veterinary Inspection (CVI).
15. All birds must be behind barriers with signage to prevent public interaction.

**PIGEON RULES AND REGULATIONS:**

1. Entries will be received until such time as the cooping capacity is reached.
2. No pigeon may compete in more than 1 class.
3. All entries must be of a recognized breed. No crossbred animals will be permitted to show.
4. All pigeons must bear a unique individual identification leg band but do not have to be identified with an official PDA leg band.
5. Exhibitors will be paid only two (2) premiums per class.
6. Substitutions permitted in the same class only!

1. No rabbit may compete in more than 1 class.
2. Rules and regulations governing open classes will apply to this section. Make a note to refer to Department 9 for breed codes.
3. All rabbits are to be judged according to the latest standard of perfection to the American Rabbit Breeders Association with ARBA Show Rules to govern.
4. All entries must be of a recognized breed. No crossbred animals will be permitted to show.
5. All rabbits must have a permanent earmark and legible tattoo in the LEFT ear.
6. NO DOE AND LITTERS WILL BE ACCEPTED.
7. **Exhibitors are to provide their own containers for water and feed.**
8. Rabbits will be shown in 4 Class and 6 Class Divisions.
9. **Exhibitors will be paid only two (2) premiums per class.**
10. **Substitutions permitted in the same class only!**

3. The management will not undertake to return exhibits, nor be responsible for the return of exhibits. Baskets or containers must be supplied by exhibitors and will be given every possible care, but management assumes no responsibility for their safety.
4. Flowers or plants entered for competition must be more than ordinary standard and quality to be entitled to an award.
5. The management may, at any time, order the removal of any exhibit that is in bad condition. Any article manifestly unfit to show may be excluded.
6. Exhibitor, except in arrangement classes, must grow all entries.
7. No exhibit may be removed at any time before the close of the exhibition except by consent of management.
8. The judge may withhold awards where they feel the entry is not worthy. The judge's decision will be final.
9. Exhibits must conform to the number of blooms, spikes or stems specified in each class.
10. Flowers in each entry must be one color and variety unless otherwise stated.
