2026 Cattle Health Regulations

****** All exhibitors, at the time of animal check-in, must provide the Fair Office with a copy of their animals' health records. The health records will be kept by the Fair Office and will not be returned to the exhibitor.******

Pennsylvania Cattle:

1. A current Certificate of Veterinary Inspection (CVI) valid for 30 days after the date of issue.
2. All animals must be free of evidence of infectious and contagious diseases.
3. Official identification is required for all cattle. Official identification includes any of the following:
 - (a) A USDA issued National Uniform Eartagging System (NUES) tag if applied prior to Nov. 5, 2024. This tag type is no longer valid for interstate movement if applied after Nov. 5, 2024.
 - (b) A 15-digit Animal Identification Number (AIN) ear tag starting with "840".
 - (c) Brands registered with a recognized brand inspection authority and accompanied by an official brand inspection certificate, when agreed to by the shipping and receiving State or Tribal animal health authorities; or
 - (d) Tattoos and other identification methods acceptable to a breed association for registration purposes, accompanied by a breed registration certificate, when agreed to by the shipping and receiving State or Tribal animal health authorities.
4. **Influenza A testing will be required if there is a case of Influenza A in dairy cattle in Pennsylvania.** Testing will be in compliance with the 2026 Pennsylvania Department of Agriculture 2026 Animal Health Requirements and Recommendations for Animal Exhibition.
5. A current rabies vaccination administered by a licensed veterinarian for animals 3 months of age and older (observe appropriate slaughter withdraw time).
6. Rodeo: It is recommended that Pennsylvania-origin rodeo cattle of all ages be negative on an official tuberculin test within 60 days prior to the start of the fair unless they are members of and originate from an accredited tuberculosis-free herd. The cattle can be accompanied by the negative test report, or the tuberculosis test results can be recorded by the veterinarian on a CVI.

Out of State Cattle: Please contact the Fair Office or the PA Department of Agriculture for additional health rules.

RELEASE TIME: Saturday, August 8, 2026 - 11:30 PM

1. To show ownership, the exhibitor's name must be on registration papers.
2. When livestock barns are filled to capacity entries will be refused based on latest postmark.
3. All animals of specific breeds must be registered with the proper breed association in the name of the exhibitors or evidence presented showing registration papers have been applied for. Exhibitors will be required to show registry papers for animals old enough to be registered and the name and number of the sire and dam of those under that age.
Registration papers and ear tattoos will be checked by the Beef Committee.
4. All unregistered animals will show under 03-Crossbred/Commercial.
5. To be eligible to compete in group classes, including 2 Females, any age, owned by exhibitor (pair a females), all animals must be entered on individual classes.
6. When on exhibit in the ring, each animal must be under halter and in charge of owner's representation.
7. All animals must be broken to show or will not be permitted in show ring.
8. Exhibitor limited to 2 premiums per class. Group classes limited to 1 entry per exhibitor.
9. Nurse cows permitted in barns if space is available.

1. To show ownership, the exhibitor's name or farm name must be on registration papers.
2. Meet all Pennsylvania Department of Agriculture Health requirements or Maryland and West Virginia equivalent for showing in a Pennsylvania show.
3. Registration papers and ear tattoos are checked at same time as Certificates of Veterinary Inspection.
4. Any exhibitor removing cattle prior to release time will not receive premium money.
5. A check for \$3.00 per animal showed must accompany the pre-registration forms for all animals in open class. Checks will be returned to the exhibitors if space limitations cause limiting the number of animals in the show.
6. If space limitations cause a decision limiting number of animals in the show, exhibitors sending in pre-registration last will be notified not to bring the animals.
7. To qualify for premiums all cattle must be registered with AHA in owner's name. Calves not registered by show date must be eligible for registration with AHA. (Proven registration of Sire and Dam.)
8. Exhibitors are responsible for providing feed and bedding for their animals. No straw or bedding will be furnished.
9. Exhibitor limited to 2 premiums per class. Group classes limited to 1 entry per exhibitor.
10. MDHA junior members must pre-register prior to the show with the MDHA official or designee to qualify for additional premiums or monetary awards.
11. **In order to participate in the MDHA show, exhibitor dues must be received by July 10, 2026 to Nancy Midla. Junior membership cost is \$10, farm fee as registered breeders is \$20, and commercial/friends of MDHA is \$10. Dues can be mailed to Nancy Midla at 34 Cranberry Marsh Road, Marianna PA 15345.**

1. Any current MDHA member (21 years and under; there is a \$10 membership free.) You do not have to be a 4-H or FFA member.
2. Any steer sired by a bull recorded in the registry of the AHA (including AHA Range Bull Registry).
3. Steers may be polled or dehorned. Scurs, if present, must be loose and not firmly attached to the head.

4. Steer must show characteristics typical of straight-bred Hereford cattle (red). Line back steers are eligible. *All steers will be suspect to inspection and will be required to meet minimum standards for type, quality and confirmation.
5. Steers may not be crossed with dairy cattle.
6. Steers should be market ready and will be judged as such.

FAYETTE COUNTY CATTLEMAN'S COUNTY BRED STEER SHOW

JUDGING: Monday, August 3, 2026 - 9:00 AM (EQT Arena)

2026 Rules:

QUALIFICATIONS:

- 1) A "county bred steer" is a market steer (a castrated male bovine raised for beef) that was born, raised, and purchased within the boundaries of Fayette County, Pennsylvania.
- 2) Open only to those 4-H youth who have enrolled in a 2026 Fayette County 4-H Market Steer project and weighed-in a Fayette County bred market steer at the fall 2025 weigh-in.
- 3) The same steer must also be entered in Department 10, Section 3B, "4-H and Vocational Market Steers" at the 2026 Fayette County Fair.
- 4) The exhibitor must identify the steer as "county bred" at the time of weigh-in. Only those Fayette County, County Bred, 4-H Market Steers weighed in on Saturday, August 1, 2026, are eligible to participate in the show.

RESPONSIBILITIES:

- 1) All exhibitors must follow the "2026 Fayette County Fair General Rules and Regulations" published in the 2026 Fayette County Fair catalog.
- 2) All exhibitors must follow the 2026 "Department 10. 4-H and Vocational, Rules and Regulations" and maintain active enrollment in a Fayette County 4-H Club.
- 3) All exhibitors must follow the 2026 "Department 10, Section 3B, 4-H and Vocational Market Steers, Rules and Regulations."
- 4) Unethical or abusive actions toward any livestock project, inappropriate or criminal behavior (on or off the fairgrounds) during the 2025-2026 4-H enrollment period may result in disqualification of the exhibitor from the county bred market steer show at the sole discretion of the Fayette County Cattleman's Association Board of Directors.
- 5) The exhibitor may be asked to supply the name and contact information of their steer breeder. False information may result in disqualification of the exhibitor from the county bred market steer show at the sole discretion of the Fayette County Cattleman's Association Board of Directors

PREREQUISITE HEALTH REGULATIONS:

All exhibitors must follow the 2026 General Rules and Health Regulations for Beef Cattle, as published in the 2026 Fayette County Fair catalog.

PROCEDURE:

- 1) All exhibitors must follow the normal 2026 “Department 10, Section 3B, 4-H and Vocational Market Steers” entry deadline, arrival, and release time.
- 2) **No additional or special entry form will be required.** A member of the Fayette County Cattleman’s Association board of directors will be present at weigh-in on Saturday, August 1, 2026. At that time, **exhibitors must declare whether they will participate in the county bred show or not.**
- 3) No entry fee will be assessed.
- 4) Judges will be accredited and services will be retained by the Fayette County Cattleman’s Association. The judge’s decisions are final.
- 5) All exhibitors are responsible to have their steers washed, groomed, and ring-side in a timely manner. Classes will not be held for late exhibitors.
- 6) Cash premiums will be issued with the ribbons for first through fifth place at the end of each class. First place winners will compete for Division Champion and Reserve, with second place winners ready to compete for Reserve.
- 7) An overall Grand Champion and Reserve Champion will be selected from the Division winners.
